he led education and advocacy efforts on all immigration policy issues for the 11,000-member professional bar association. He has been a leader in national and grassroots coalitions advance progressive immigration policies and has been one of the key legislative strategists in support of comprehensive immigration reform, serving as a media spokesperson on a broad array of immigration policy and legislative issues.
